

Overview – Texas Regional Pathways Network

Texas faces a significant challenge in helping students achieve college and career readiness, earn postsecondary degrees and credentials, and enter careers aligned with current and future workforce needs. Regional efforts that engage cross-sector stakeholders in developing high-quality career and education pathways are a critically important strategy for addressing this challenge. These pathways provide opportunities for students to acquire dual credit, earn industry-based certifications, postsecondary credentials, complete work-based learning opportunities aligned to targeted industries, and receive effective advising support to successfully navigate pathways The purpose of this grant is to assist workforce development regions with providing high quality career and education pathways that are aligned to the targeted industry identified in this grant project. Regions in the Texas Regional Pathways Network commit to developing pathways that include the seven key components of high-quality career and education pathways.

7 Key Components of a Texas Regional Pathways Network

Cross-sector partnerships;

Alignment with high wage, in-demand labor market information (greater than \$35,339 annual salary and greater than 17% annual growth for the state);

Links between secondary and postsecondary education with multiple entry and exit points;

Credentials and degrees with value in the labor market;

Integration of rigorous academics and career-focused learning;

Strong college and career advising and counseling supports; and

Continuum of work-based learning experiences







Understanding the Effective Advising Framework

The Effective Advising Framework defines five key levers that, together, form the foundation of effective advising programs. For each lever, the framework outlines commitments that must be made at the district and campus levels to enable programmatic success, and essential actions that must be taken to propel that success. The five key levers include Strong Program Leadership and Planning; Effective, Well-Supported School Counselors and Advisors; Internal School Culture of Advising; Effective External Partnerships; and High-Quality Advising Materials and Assessments.


